Peggy Lambert grew up in NJ with music all around her. She was an accomplished pianist, violinist And choral singer from a young age. Her first job in NYC was as music coordinator for NBC's *Home Show* starring Arlene Francis. As a young mom raising three children, Peggy taught piano for many years in Wayland, MA, and also taught music at the local nursery school.

Peggy continued her involvement in music through the years in Wayland, singing in the Masterworks Chorale including performing at Tanglewood under the baton on Seiji Ozawa!), the St. Ann's Choir and several area choral groups. When Peggy and husband, David, retired to Cape Cod, she continued to share her musical gifts in her new home. She played violin and performed in a local string quartet, performed in two-piano recitals, played piano at a hospice in Orleans, sang for many years with the Chatham Chorale. She became director of the Cape Conservatory Parent Organization; in addition she collaborated with Symphony, and supported local students sharing similar passions. Her love of music permeated everything she touched.

For Peggy, music was joy. We have been greatly enriched by the passion she brought to all aspects of our music community. In gratitude, Chatham Music Club has established a named scholarship to honor the memory of Peggy Lambert.
